IN THE NAME OF GOD + A.M.E. I CHARLES GREENBERRY  
of ANN Arundel County, Esq. being sick of Body but sound  
and perfect mind and memory, Bless be God for the same, Do  
hereby constitute and ordain my last will and testament in  
manner and form following Vis:

I recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty God  
whencever it shall please him to call it and my body to the  
earth as my Executrix hereafter mentioned shall think fit.

Item 1. I do hereby give, devise and bequeath unto my dear wife  
Rachel Greenberry all my real estate, lands or tenements of  
what nature or kind soever during her natural life and after  
her decease I give, devise and bequeath unto the Vestry of  
Westminster Parish, for support and maintenance of a Minister  
in the same Parish and to their successors forever all that  
my Plantation called Whitehall and the land thereto belonging,  
to the use of the Minister of the same Parish and his succe-  
sors forever.

Item 2. I do give and bequeath unto my Sisters, Anna, the wife  
of John Hammond and Elizabeth, the wife of Robert Goldsborough,  
twenty pounds each.

Item 3. I give and bequeath unto my loving cousins, Henry Ridgley  
Nicholas Ridgley, Anne Ridgley and Catherine Howard, two cows  
and two yearlings each and also five pounds to each and eveypp  
of them.

Item 4. I give and bequeath unto John Tegar, a Cow and Calf.

Item 5. Lastly, I give and bequeath unto my dear wife, all the  
residue of my personal Estate after my just debts and legacies  
are paid and do constitute, ordain and appoint my said loving  
wife to be the full and sole Executrix of this my last will  
and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made  
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my seal this 7th day of February Anno. Domini One thousand  
Seven hundred and ten
