

January 1935.

The regular meeting of the Church Service League of St. Margarets was held in the Parish Hall on Friday Jan. 11<sup>th</sup> with twenty six members present.

Rev. R.C. Cowling, Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The roll call was dispensed with.

Mr. Alex Proskier, Treasurer gave a report of the finances of the Church for year ending Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> 1934. This report shows that the total indebtedness on the Hall is now \$1000. There was a balance in bank beginning of year of \$17.39. It was necessary for the Treasurer to get a loan of \$250.00 to meet current expenses and he was unable to meet the convention expenses of \$70.00 this year, all due to the fact that part of the funds from payment of interest is in arrears. The amount of interest due is \$390.00 which when collected will be ample to take care of our present needs. Balance in bank Dec. 31, 1934 was \$9.42.

In view of the fact that Mr. Frank Corbier, Treasurer of

The Mission fund was unable to be present due to illness, his report was read by Mrs. Corner Redout.

This report showed a balance at the beginning of year of \$8.07. Collections for year including Christmas and Easter collections and a special Sunday school collection were \$230.96.

\$229.00 of this amount was sent to the Treasurer of the Mission Fund in Baltimore.

# Thanksgiving Day collections of 6.11 was donated to the Emergency Hospital.

The special canvass, Everyman's Offering amounted to \$63.00. Balance in bank Dec. 31, 1934 was \$1.96.

Mrs. Cowling Treasurer of the Sunday School gave an interesting report of the work of the Sunday School in 1934. The total collections for the year were \$93.07. Special collection of 6.40 was given to the Mission Treasurer.

Mrs. Oliver Macey, Treasurer of the Ladies Guild reported that there were 29 members on the roll. The amount of money taken in during the year from dues and rummage sales was \$81.26. The expenses for the year were \$78.56.

Balance in bank Dec. 31, 1934 was \$55.22, and balance in hand \$2.70.

Miss Margaret Ridout gave a report of the activities of the Guild for 1934.

There was no report from Mrs. George Norris Treasurer of the St. Margaret's branch of the Woman's auxiliary.

Mrs. Orlando Ridout Jr. Chairman of the Committee in Charge of beautifying the Church grounds reported that there was a balance on hand of \$22.50. She asked to have the fence between the Rectory and Cemetery moved to straighten the line before planting trees.

Motion carried to give a rising vote of thanks to each officer for the interesting reports prepared by each.

Rev. Mr. Cowling Mr. Prockey and Mr. Corner Ridout gave their impressions of <sup>the</sup> Bishop's Peace Car. and the remainder of the evening was spent in a general discussion of the Car. It was finally decided in order, some and all who would like to have a car call on the Rector, then if the demand is great enough a Custodian will then be appointed to take charge of them.

Mrs. George Norris gave an interesting talk in favor of the Bishop Peace Car.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mrs. Orlando Ridout which was passed and the meeting adjourned at ten o'clock.
