

Jan. 1932.

The regular meeting of the Church Service League of St. Margaret's was held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday January 13th. These meetings are usually held on the second Friday of the month, but due to inclement weather it was thought advisable to postpone it to the following Wednesday.

The Rev. P. C. Cowling, Chairman presided over the meeting which was opened at 8 P. M. with prayer.

After the reading of the minutes of the last meeting the Chairman called on Mr. Proskoy Sec. & Treas. of the Church finances for a report of the year ending Dec. 31, 1931. This report showed a balance on hand of \$186.81. Mr. Proskoy reported that the church received \$1280.20 interest on invested funds per year and that our present in-

debtness was \$2800.00. He showed that the past year had been very prosperous in as much as many improvements had been made and that conditions in this Parish were as good if not better than in many others, as we were able to pay all bills when due.

Mr. Frank Corner, Mission Treasurer was called to give a report of the Nation Wide Campaign Fund. This report was very gratifying as it showed that St. Margaret's Church had fully met its obligations for the past year and had a balance on Dec. 31, 1931 of \$1.57.

Mrs. Cowling gave a very fine report of the Sunday School for the past year. She reported that it was entirely self supporting and that there was a balance on hand of \$18.30.

As the treasurer of the Ladies Guild

was absent Mrs. P. C. Cowling read her report which was most satisfactory. It showed that there are 38 members on the roll and that the Guild had been very active during 1931, having had the Memorial Window put in the Chancel of the Church besides doing many other things.

Mr. Cowling spoke on the canvass and of the lack of interest shown by the people in attending meetings. The every member canvass was discussed.

Mr. Cowling reported that there were three times as many baptisms as in any previous year since he has been here but also the death rate was the largest. The Church having lost some of its most devoted members. He asked if there were any suggestions

for improvements or any other
work for the coming year.

Mr. Frank Corner suggested that
the back porch of the hall be fixed
as it was dangerous to use it as it
is, also that gutters are needed
on the Hall and the electric
wiring should have some attention
as some of it is in a bad condition.

A motion for adjournment
was made seconded and approved
and the meeting adjourned at
9.45 P.M.
