

January 1936.

The regular meeting of the Church Service League was held in the Parish Hall on Friday evening, Jan. 16, with 37 members present.

Rev. R. C. Cowling, Chairman presided and opened the meeting with prayers.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A motion was adopted to dispense with the roll call.

Mr. Alex Proskoy, Treasurer, gave a report of the finances of the Church for the year ending Dec. 31, 1935. This report shows that the total indebtedness is now \$1750.00 which is \$750.00 more than it was at the same time last year, due to the fact that the interest on one of the investments is overdue about \$1000. Mr. Proskoy expects this situation to be cleared up in March of this year and the \$750.00 will be taken care of.

That all outstanding bills have been paid to date and that the Parish is in a fairly healthy condition. The balance in Bank Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> 1936 is \$73.44.

Mr. Frank Corner, Treasurer of the Mission Fund, read his

report which showed a balance at the beginning of the year of \$1.96. Collections for the year including Sunday school quote boxes, plate collectibles on Easter Sunday and Christmas Day and Friday night collections during Lent and amount paid on pledges amounted to \$213.88, \$200. of this amount was sent to the Treasurer of the Mission Fund in Balliniske, leaving a balance in bank Jan. 1, 1936 of \$13.88. Thanksgiving Day collections which was \$16.57 was not credited to the mission fund but donated to the Chase Home.

Mrs. P. C. Cowling, Treasurer of the Sunday School gave an interesting report of the work of the Sunday School. The collections for the year ending Dec. 31<sup>st</sup> 1935 amounted to \$97.20. The expenses which included reward pins, flowers, Christmas wreaths, lesson papers, candy, ice cream and oranges etc. amounted to \$74.22. Balance in bank Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> 1936 \$23.00.

Mrs. Oliver Macey, Treasurer of The Ladies Guild reported twenty four active members. Balance in bank Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> 1935 was \$55.22. Money collected from dues and rummage sales

during the year amounted to \$70.00 and expenses for year were \$33.63 leaving a balance in bank Jan. 1<sup>st</sup> 1936, \$90.53.

Miss Margaret Bidou gave a report of the activities of the Guild during 1935.

Mrs. C. Bidou Jr. Chairman of the Committee for beautifying the Church grounds reported a balance of \$20.00 also that Mr. Eble will replace the tree which was planted in memory of Bishop Murray and which has died, with a cedar tree.

No report from Mrs. George Norris, Treasurer of the W. L. O.

Mr. Corner Bidou, Custodian of the Pence Cans reported a total of \$44.91 from collections in 1935.

Mr. Cowling explained the use of the Pence Cans again and called attention to the prayers which are printed on the Cans. He reported well attended Lenten services, and a splendid Congregation on Christmas Day but Sunday services poorly attended. Also reported six baptisms, eight burials and ten confirmed during the year of 1935. Mr. Cowling urged all members of his congregation to use the red side of their Church

envelopes.

A discussion of how to clean up the Cemetery and get rid of the honeysuckle followed. Mr. Frank Duwall and family offered to give \$15.00 to help with this work.

Motion adopted to ask Mr. Duwall to meet with Vestry to make definite decision about Cemetery also to appoint a Committee to get in touch with Lot owners to ask for donations to help defray expenses of having the work done. Mr. Frank Corner was appointed Chairman of this Committee.

Mr. Hirsch was asked to oil Church bell and to examine the rafters which have been reported in bad condition.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mr. Hirsch and passed and the meeting adjourned at 9.45.
